Old and/or Ongoing Business

1. Treasurer's report — Rachel

February 2021 notable items: Income \$882.10, Young People's (YP) retreat listed as 'event income.' Expenses: \$183.42. Working balance \$5,828.21.

Income for February includes \$300 from registrations for the YP retreat. Total income is approx. \$1,000. MWI assisted the independent YP retreat by collecting registration fees on its behalf. MWI will disperse these funds as directed by the YP committee. Nate will connect with the YP committee to ask how they would like this income dispersed.

Strategic Goal Updates

• Website — Nancy

We had over 3,900 new users on the website, and strong traffic. Up 18% since last month. Users are looking for meetings. Top searches for binge eating disorder, eating disorder and OA. We are targeting the younger demographic (18-34), and hits are being driven by Google Ad Words (Is OA for you, 15 questions). In addition to the USA, the UK continues to be strongly represented. Newcomers page up for ~ 1 week already had 123 visitors.

Nancy will be working to optimize the website (page takes too long to load) (google likes quick loading pages, ranks sites based on this) spend \$\$ to optimize site.

<u>Crisp chat function</u> has been added to the MWI website & is working well. Currently we have 4 people supporting the chat (Michael P, Liz D, Laura C and Nancy). Barbara J is coordinating the volunteers. Shelley also volunteered as well as several others. What is great about the crisp chat is that folks supporting the chat can put their schedule in Crisp; you show as a 'green dot' when you are available. Purchased unlimited monthly account.

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- Social Media Nancy (Laura C cannot attend these meetings). (subcommittee members: Nancy, Michael P, Kat L, Susan G, Shelley, Laura C). Laura C has been posting (and 'promoting' posts) on social media (IG and Facebook) to target younger demographic, focusing on sharing MWI events and E/S/H. The YP Retreat was 'promoted'
- Diversity / Inclusion (D / I) Lane (subcommittee members: Lane, Bob K, Kat L, Sue A, Susan G, Damien, Suzanne, Barbara J). Meets once a month. Drafted text to add to website, talks about importance of D / I, and suggestions for meetings to support D / I. Lane, Suzanne, and Susan G are working on editing text. Michael and Nancy asked to publicize next meeting (newsletter and website). Please attend.
- Sponsor bank coordinator Damien. Reported that there have been 4 inquiries since last MWI meeting. Damien reaching out to everyone on list to ensure they still want to be on the list.
- Workshops:

SPECIAL TOPICS – Lane. We need a new special topic workshop coordinator. This person will be trained, there are scripts and template emails to support the role. Workshop 'Writing What We Wish We Read: Finding the Language that Works for Our Recovery' went well.

NEWCOMERS – Janet. Janet is sending emails to those newcomers who have signed up to attend the newcomer workshops. Janet has leaders set up until July. Please connect with Janet if you'd like to volunteer – this is easy to do: there's a format, you read from the script. Great way to do service!

Sponsor training workshop – Blair. 6 session workshop to go through the 'Where Do I Start?' pamphlet. Great first session on 13 MAR 2021 with 3 attendees, 3 additional fellows registered for today's session. Registration is now closed.

- Joint speaker bank with MBI Susan G (subcommittee members: Susan G, Sue M, Jen B, Jack G, Michael P). Susan G & Michael will meet after this meeting.
- 'Where Do I Start?' pamphlet distribution to MWI meeting attendees Mark. Still sending out pamphlets, going well! Please remind folks it's a physical pamphlet that is mailed to their address. Folks will not go on any telemarketing lists. Return address from Mark himself. Mark asked about sending pamphlets internationally. Rachel said we have budget for this and to request reimbursement.
- YP Retreat Report Nate. Very well attended first of its kind (of which we're aware). Approx. 300 people attended. Thanks to MWI for their support with registration, treasury, moderation and other behind-the-scenes support.
- New Phone line volunteer Nate. Steve M. has volunteered to take over the google voice # from Sarah M. Thanks to Sarah M. for her service.

New Business:

1. Region 6 expansion for what we've been doing in the web arena: Michael P and Nancy. Michael brought up the idea to hand off what we've been doing for outreach, searches using Google Ads, chat, & newcomers. Instead of giving our google ad words searches to individual intergroups, the thought would be to move to R6. MWI will still do the things we're doing now and get results of our outreach. If we give Google Ad words to R6 for a coordinated approach there will be a much broader potential service area, financial backing. We can get more than \$3,000 of Google ads if R6 is involved (e.g. Suffolk, R6, and MWI would each get \$3,000 for ads). The \$3,000 worth of Google ads is provided at no cost to non-profit organizations. MWI (nor R6, etc) does not pay for these Google ads. It was

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brought up that different IGs could adopt a topic / special focus meeting type, i.e. Suffolk supporting LGBT, CMI supporting Men. We give R6 our IP and see if we can scale this.
